After High School he joined the U.S. Army and served in Vietnam. Later he was a member of the VFW Honor Guard. He was a family man who enjoyed the outdoors, camping, and ice fishing. He had a passion for motorcycles and taking his wife for rides on their Harley. Most of all, he loved spending time with his family and friends.

He is survived by his wife Sally Hill of Glidden, their three children; Harvey (Lisa Leinwander) Hill of Marshfield, Paul (Nickie) Hill of Minneapolis, Rachel (Scott) Coe of Phoenix, two grandchildren; Addison and Zane Hill of Marshfield, by his mother-in-law Helen Krucky, and by nieces, nephews, and other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents and two

sisters, Lena Hill-Wright and Letha Hill-Spear and father-in-law James Krucky.

A memorial service with military honors will be announced at a later date.
