My Mom made him a couple hot dogs and while he was eating Mom asked him where his Mom and Dad were and Herman said in his deep manly voice “they’re on their second honeymoon.” Shortly after that Herb and Shirley arrived and said Herman was staying with them while Betty and Chuck were out of town. Herman held a special place in my heart and was just adorable I will never forget this. Over the years Herman became a constant in my life when he was working as a supervisor for a tree cutting service in the Twin Cities he came to our house to cut a dead tree down in our front yard. When he finished he said “Joycee that big Maple in your back yard has to go too. “ I said no—that is the only shade tree in my back yard. He did his cute smile and gently patted me on the back. That tree is still standing and I think of Herman every time I look at it. Many times over the years when I went to my brothers cabin Herman would stop and give me that gentle pat on the back. One time when he stopped he said get in the car we are going to go catch two walleye’s. We did catch two walleye’s. Herman said “Joycee you can come here every day and catch two walleye’s but that is all you will catch and don’t tell anyone else about this spot.” Herman was very caring of others. He was there for his friends and family when they were ill and he called me and expressed his concerns for them. He loved and cared about his Mom and Dad. When he married Lisa he told me she is the best thing that has ever happened to him. He visited my Mom numerous times at her apartment and in the nursing home. Herman sat with us for a while when she was dying. My Mom used to call and tell me Herman stopped to visit her—she would say how much she liked Herman. I am sure my Mom greeted Herman with open arms as well as all the other loved ones that have passed before him. Rest in peace
