He lived in Milwaukee while working for Rex Chain Belt, moved to Warren, PA to work for Rexnord Thomas Coupling Division, and later to Libertyville, IL as an Industrial Relations Coordinator for Outboard Marine Corporation in Waukegan. In 1980 he began his career as Human Resource Director at

Flambeau Paper Mill in Park Falls, WI where he worked until his retirement.

He was deeply devoted to his family and God. He loved spending time outdoors camping, fishing, kayaking, and traveling to parks throughout America. He enjoyed many hobbies including photography, woodworking, reading, writing, ham radio (WD9AEI), playing cards with his buddies, watching the Packers and Brewers and general tinkering. He was active in the Lions Club, Flambeau Hospital Board, VFW, American Legion, the Catholic Church and was a 4th Degree Knight of Columbus.

He was preceded in death by his parents and his daughter, Jeanne (Jan) Huml.
