“ *On the few occasions that I interacted with Lawrence it was to ask him to bury a horse or some similar "work" related activity. The most memorable occasion took place when our horse, Decker, died at the Price County Fair. The horse had rolled over our daughter (she was massively bruised but not otherwise seriously injured). I called Lawrence to ask what it would cost to have the horse buried and Lawrence said "Don't worry about it." I later found out that the backhoe was on a job in Glidden. He drove up, loaded the backhoe, came down to Fifield, buried the horse, loaded the backhoe and took it back to Glidden. I asked what I owed him and he waved it off saying "I'm doing it for the girl." He wouldn't even take money to cover the cost of fuel. I will never forget the kindness and generosity embodied in that act.*
